MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Tēnā koutou, Talofa lava, Malo e lelei, Nihao, こんにちは, 안녕하세요, Zdravo, Fakaalofa lahi atu, Kia ora whānau, नमस्ते, As-Salam-u-Alaikum

Kia ora whānau,
Welcome to Week 8 Term 3.

We are gearing up for a Market Day, in Week 10 on Thursday. This is our big event for Term 3. The Market starts at 11am with the children's stalls of the goods they have created. Our theme was BOREDOM BUSTERS. All children's items will be priced \$1-2. At 12pm our kai stalls will start selling their kai. There will be a sausage sizzle, drinks, ice-blocks, baking and more on sale. All whānau welcome! Year 6 students please bring some baking to sell at the cake stall as a camp fundraiser. At 1pm we have syndicate and cultural performances. We hope it is a nice sunny day and everyone can enjoy the market, and sit on the courts, have a picnic and watch the performances. We aim to be cleaned up and finished by 2:30pm. This is the first time we have done this in this manner, thank you for your support and understanding. If it is bad weather that week we will postpone.

It is the time of year where we start planning for 2025. At the moment, we are taking enrolments for our bilingual units for 2025. We have three bilingual units at Sunnyvale- Samoan, Te Reo Māori and Hindi. These classes are whānau grouped and are open to children from Years 1-6. Our bilingual units are very successful- the children are thriving, have very high rates of progress and progress at accelerated rates. They continue with their learning in Reading, Writing and Maths in the same manner as the rest of the school- English is not compromised, it is enhanced- by learning through and within culture. Our Hindi class encompasses Hindu, Muslim and Punjabi culture. All of our bilingual units are open to anyone of any ethnicity, and we can take out of zone enrolments for these classes. We have 5 spaces available in Ngā Kākano, 6 spaces in Gyan Deep, and 6 spaces in Nafanua. If you would like your child/ren to be on the list please contact us. If you have friends or family out of zone and they would like to enrol, please ask them to contact us.
